DEAR FRIENDS...

We are not gods, we are God's! Believe it or not, that statement comes not from some great work of Christian theology. Rather, it comes from graffiti on an electrical cabinet on a street on the south side of Edinburgh. It seems a simple sentence, yet it is also one of deep

profundity and is relevant to the world we live in today.

Everything from mainstream politics, popular philosophy, and advertising through to the subjective world of social media tells us that we are the centre of the universe. We are told that everything needs to be based on our desires, our happiness, and our values. It is as if they believe the universe revolves around the individual. That is, perhaps, okay if your name is Zaphod Beeblebrox and you exist only as a character in fiction of Douglas Adams. That character though, who did believe that the universe revolved around him, exemplified the spirit of that age and this one. In other words, our world wants us to perceive ourselves as gods. The writer of that line of graffiti clearly thinks otherwise.

As this edition of *ReidOn*... is published we will be approaching Easter. It is a time, a festival, of great joy. It is also a celebration of the justice and mercy of God. Through the resurrection of Jesus, God calls us once more into His presence. Through that same act, He also opens a path for us to approach Him. In this we are reminded that we are His, we are God's. It is a message that appears regularly throughout scripture, especially in the Prophets and the

letters of Paul. Clearly, the writers of scripture believed it. It is as we accept that truth and as we begin to live it that we also begin to realise that it offers us both real hope and real strength.

In a world dominated by so many personal 'truths' we need the foundation that only God can give. Living in the truth that we are God's will enable us to resist the temptation to follow the world into believing that we are gods. We will find ourselves in accord with the writer of the graffiti. We will find ourselves living in Truth.

FABRIC COMMITTEE...

Stevie and his team have been working hard on the Reid's behalf: he will be submitting a full report to the annual Congrgational Board meeting, but here's a brief summary:

It has been another tough and busy year for Fabric. On top of the normal demands of maintaining a grade A listed building we had: • Our 5 yearly electrical inspection condition report (EICR), with all the required remedial work • Significant issues with our church radiators • Our long-term Gardener resigned and we needed to find and re-appoint new gardeners • Our Quinquennial inspection • Challenges sourcing suitable companies to carry out lightening conductor inspection and repairs • The increasing use of our church and halls as a rental space, increasing our day-to-day activities.

Israelis mark the 100th day since the atrocity on 7th October

As you'll know from past issues of ReidOn..., MURIEL PEARSON is the Church of Scotland Mission Partner for Israel and Palestine. She and Rev Dr Stewart Gillan have recently returned there, and we follow her mission at the World Church Committee. To summarise her latest newsletter:

While in Scotland Muriel spoke to groups and churches and led worship online with the congregation of St Andrew's Jerusalem and Tiberias. But tensions continue to run high across the region with daily encounters between the Israeli Defence Force and Hezbollah. While the images on the news of destroyed buildings and people picking through rubble by hand looking for survivors are horrific an endless stream of misery reported on by Gazan journalists who have seen 82 of their number killed since hostilities stepped up - Israel's news is full of reminders of the atrocities experienced by Israelis at the hands of Hamas, designed to stoke determination to continue the war.

UN and World Health officials and others talk about the scale of need and the impossibility of responding. The situation is polarised and it is hard to see a constructive way forward addressing the fears and needs of both Palestinians and Israelis. There are, however, some refreshing and encouraging voices. *Rabbis for* >

> Human Rights, who have themselves been affected by October 7th, have remained determined to behave with humanity, based on the Biblical injunctions to 'Love mercy, do justice and walk humbly with God'.

UK organisation *Together4Humanity* held events for people to come together to 'Build Bridges'. They say 'We're building a movement for everyone who believes in the importance of standing together for humanity, and uniting against hate.' And as Christian Aid's prayer puts it, 'Pray not for Arab or Jew, for Palestinian or Israeli, but pray rather for ourselves, that we might not divide them in our prayers but keep them both together in our hearts.'

Pictured is Lawrence Foster, conducting the BBC Symphony Orchestra at The Barbican, London, performing American composer John Cage's 1968 three-movement piece 4'33" - during which, as you might know, the performers remain silent and the only audible sounds are the surrounding random ambient noises, buzzing, breathing, throat-clearing etc. It's an absorbing and unique piece, different every time it's performed, inviting the audience fundamentally to *listen*. The Bible has plenty of advice about staying silent, [see link] among the most-quoted being Ecclesiastes 3: 7 - 'a time to be silent and a time to speak', Psalm 37:7 'Be silent in

the LORD's presence and wait patiently for him.', and Zephaniah 1:7 'Stand in silence in the presence of the Sovereign LORD'. More interesting maxims about silence can be found **here**.
