A LONG AND WINDING ROAD?

One of the most commonly used words to describe our life of faith is 'journey;' it is not a new expression, dating, as it does, back

at least as far as the high middle-ages. After all the nave, that part of the church where the congregation sit, derives its name from the Latin for 'ship.' The idea of faith as a journey is old indeed. Throughout scripture the life of faith as journey is seen in a quite literal way. From Abram leaving Ur, through the Hebrews in the wilderness, to the traves of Saint Paul they are clear to see.

One major difference between now and then is that today travelling such distances is relatively quick and easy. We can travel on public transport to the far side of the world in less time than it would have taken two of the disciples to walk from the Mediterranean coast to the eastern border of the Promised Land. Yet, despite the passage of time and the increasing ease of journeying the idea continues to serve as a metaphor for us. For some the journey is what matters whereas for others it is the arriving that counts. Some, though, value the encounters along the way as the most fulfilling elements of a journey, whether literal or not.

One feature of the Bible stories in the immediate post-Easter period is that they are ones of encounter. They are not encounters of one person with another but of people with the Risen Lord. Each has a series of common threads, yet each is also unique. Likewise, today, we each encounter the Risen Christ in unique ways.

For some the encounter is sudden and unexpected while, >

> for others, the encounter is lifelong and ever-present. Just like the stories of scripture, and just like each of us, they are unique.

Ahead of us as congregation and individuals there will be many challenges to our faith. Not least, these will come through the changes wrought by the planning and restructuring of the wider Kirk. Our ways of working will change, and our values will be challenged. To make it through we will need to hold on to our stories of faith and encounter with the Risen Lord. It is these that will offer us hope and encouragement when we want to give up or walk away. Our stories are unique, but they are not ours alone for they are Christ's too; they tell the story of the love of God for each of us. So, hold on tight to your story, own it, and live it.

ALL IN THE MONTH OF MAY

IT WAS 250 YEARS AGO, on 10th May 1773 that Britain passed the Tea Act, which favoured the British East India Company over the American colonies, which led to the Boston Tea Party in December, which escalated into the American Revolution and the establishment of the USA.

150 YEARS AGO, on 1st May 1873 that David Livingstone, Scottish missionary and explorer, died. Best known for his search for the sources of the Nile, and for going missing (and being found) in Africa.

100 YEARS AGO, on 26th-27th May 1923 that the first Le Mans 24 hours endurance motor race was held.

90 YEARS AGO, on 2nd May 1933 that the first modern sighting of Scotland's Loch Ness monster was reported in the Inverness Chronicle.

80 YEARS AGO, on 16th-17th May 1943 that the RAF launched Operation Chastise, which became famous as the 'Dambusters' Raid'. Bouncing bombs were used to bypass anti-torpedo nets and breach dams, which caused catastrophic flooding in Germany's Ruhr Valley.

75 YEARS AGO, on 14th-15th May 1948 that Israel was declared an independent state as the British mandate in Palestine came to an end. Next day the Arab-Israeli War began with the invasion of Israel by Egypt, Transjordan, Lebanon, Syria and Iraq. > > **70 YEARS AGO**, on 29th May 1953 that New Zealand mountaineer Edmund Hilary and Sherpa Tenzing Norgay became the first people to reach the summit of Mount Everest.

60 YEARS AGO, on 27th May 1963 that the folk/blues album 'The Freewheelin' Bob Dylan' was released. It included the hit song 'Blowin' in the Wind'.

50 YEARS AGO, on 17th May 1973 that the Watergate hearings began in the US Senate and were televised nationally.

40 YEARS AGO, on 20th May 1983 that the journal Science reported the discovery of the HIV virus that causes AIDS.

25 YEARS AGO, on 23rd May 1998 that in a referendum, the people of Northern Ireland voted to accept the Good Friday Agreement. 75% were in favour of a Northern Ireland Assembly.

15 YEARS AGO, on 12th May 2008 that the Sichuan earthquake took place in China. More than 69,000 people were killed, over 370,000 injured, and nearly five million made homeless.
